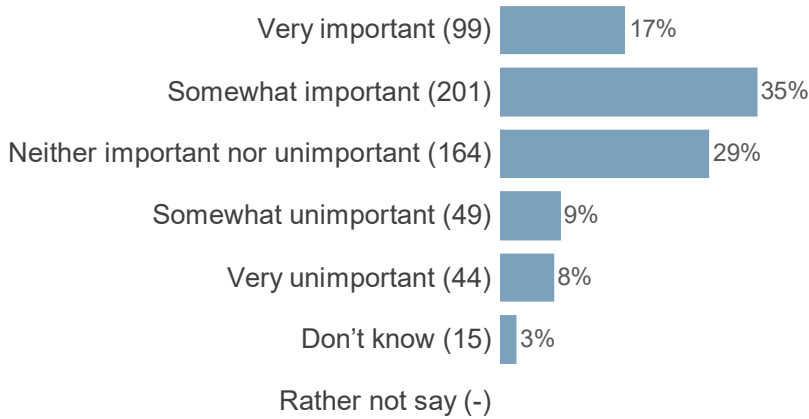

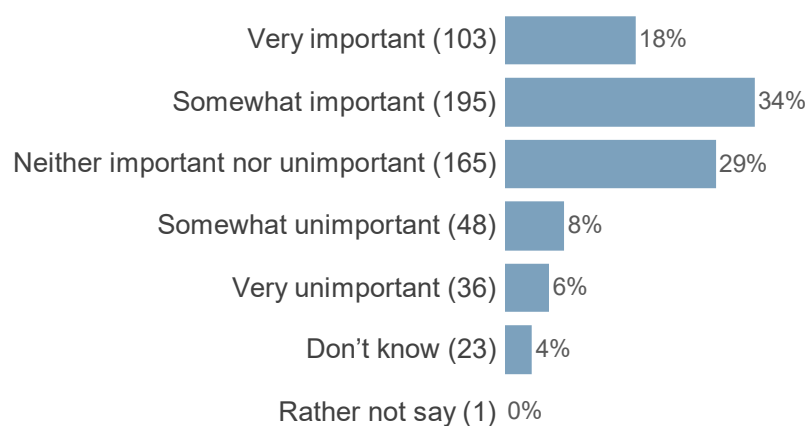

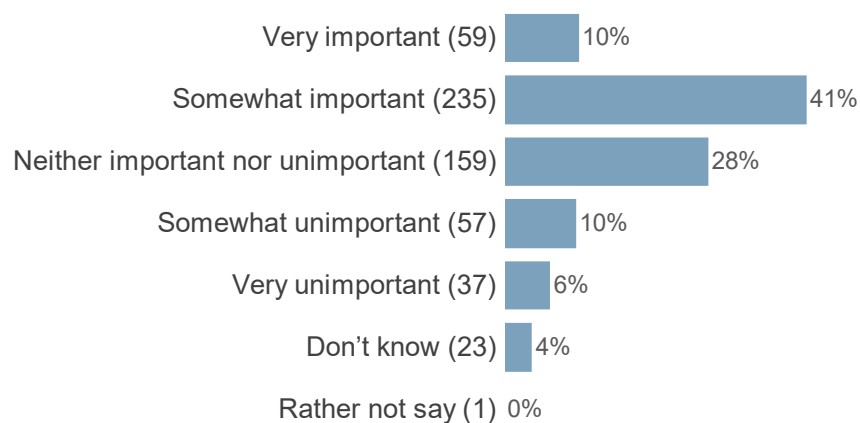

That as a uni or society, we grow with the expectations and norms but in a way that does not affect the environment around us.

Sustainable development is the ability any person, workplace or setting has to improve its impact upon the environment. It also encompasses the capability the individuals have in setting achievable plans and targets so that the risk of failure is minimal and the ability of succeeding is high.

Sustainable development means that a system or country can continue developing at its current rate for a long time (theoretically forever) without the affect of any external factors and with the current rate of consumption of resources. This meets the needs of the present without sacrificing the needs of future generations

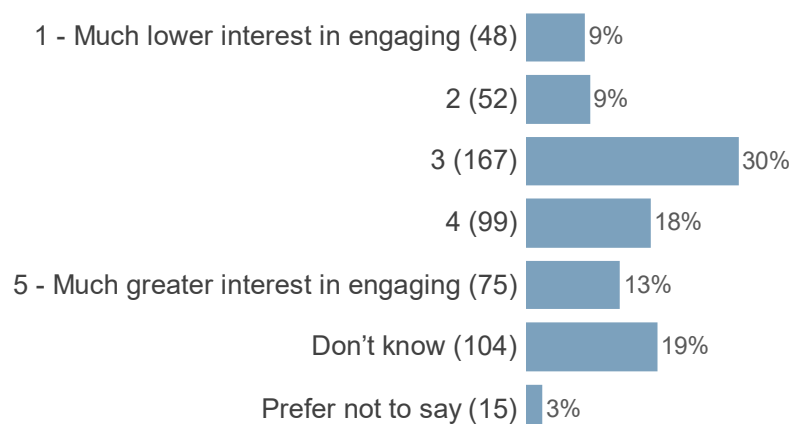

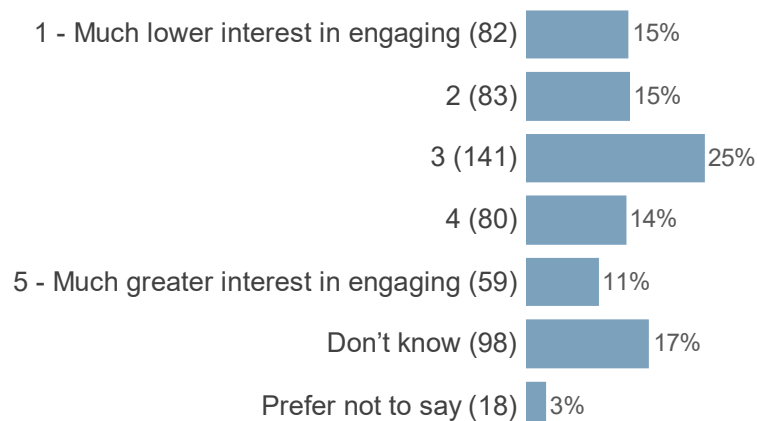

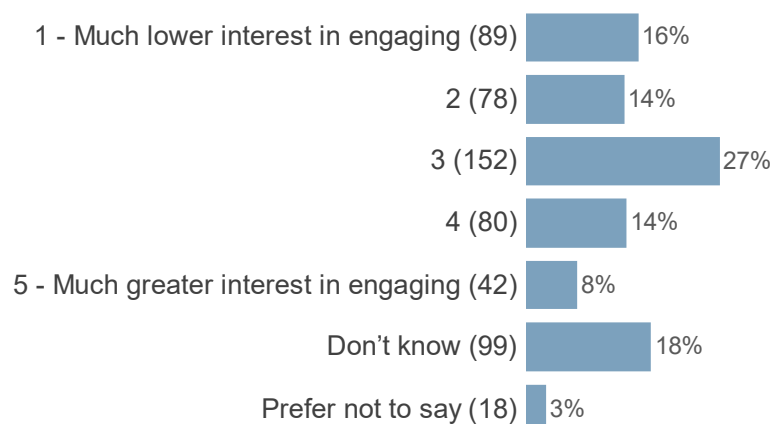

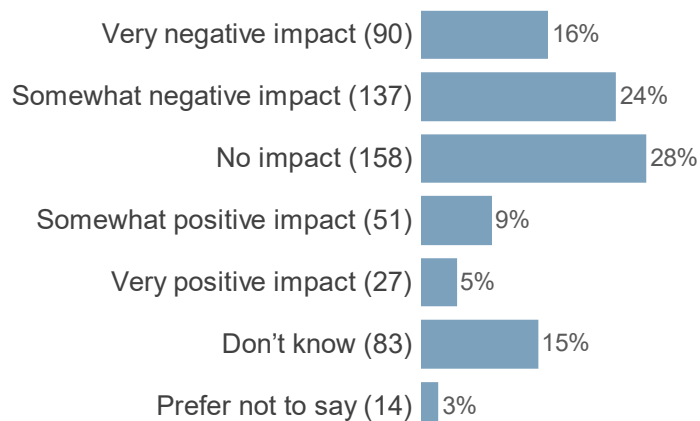

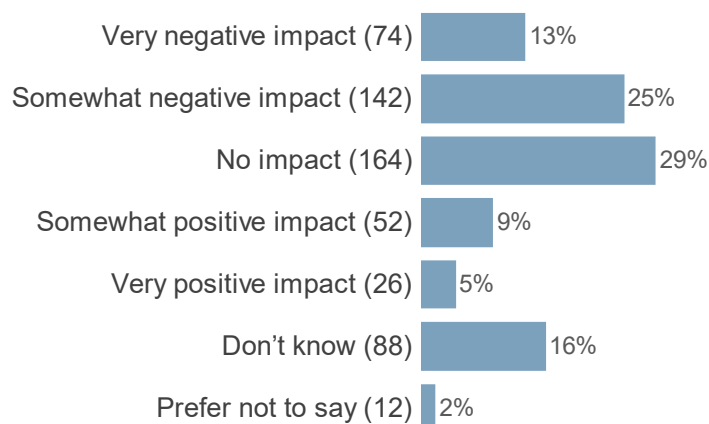
